We all are amazing, each in our own way.

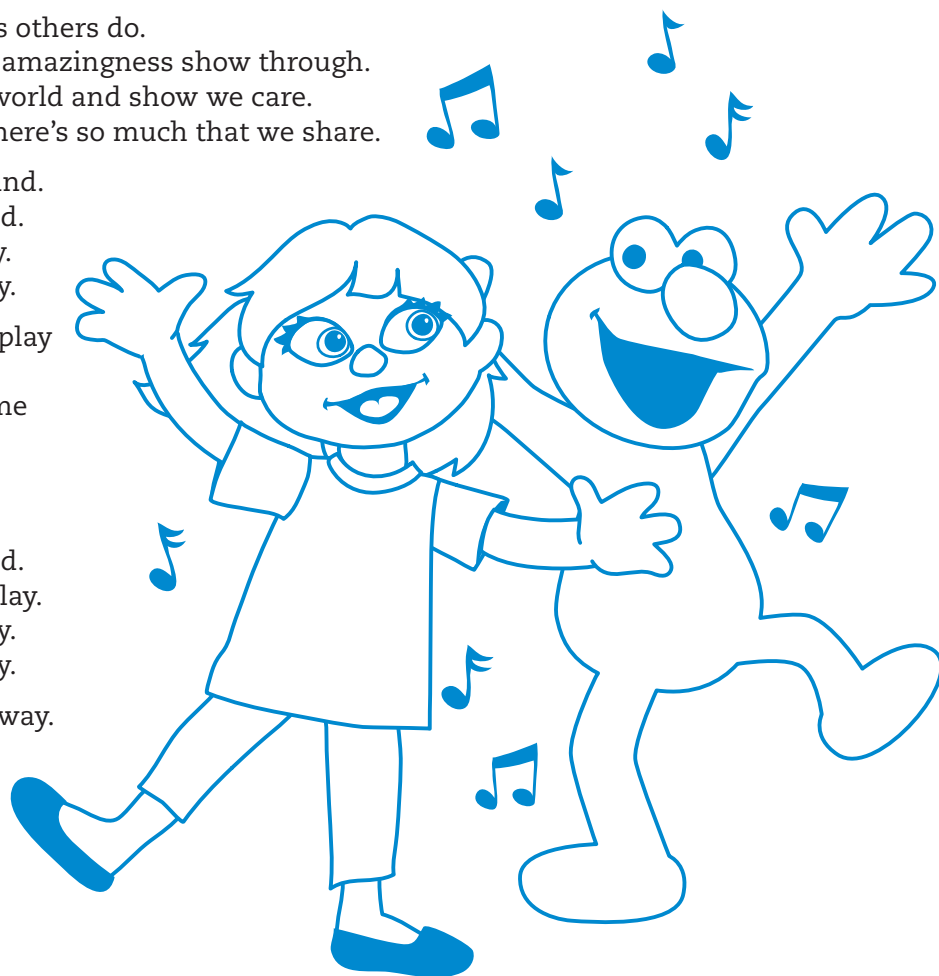
For some of us it’s harder to reach out as others do.
